

2016-2017 Focus on Globalization: Spring Term Events

This 2016-2017 academic year—the final year of a three-year series on *Globalization*—the Center for Global Education is sponsoring events and offering courses focused particularly on the "contested concept" of globalization. This term, four events are planned:

Allos Musica Ensemble

Monday, April 3, 7:00-9:00pm Wentz Concert Hall

Founded in 2006 by James Falzone (former North Central College professor), *Allos Musica* explores the intersections of contemporary classical, jazz, and traditional music from the Middle East and Europe. Featuring clarinet and various ethnic winds, the oud (an ancient Arab lute), voice, accordion, and percussion instruments from around the world, Allos Musica seamlessly blends tradition and experimentation. The concert also features the North Central College Chamber Singers, performing music written especially for them by Professor Falzone.

Globalization Under Fire Wednesday, April 26, 6:30-9:00pm 2nd Floor, WAC

Wrapping up our three-year series on *Globalization: A Contested Concept*, this student-led conference features an opening talk by Professor William Muck, associate professor of political science, followed by three sets of concurrent sessions with NCC international students and students enrolled in *globalization* courses on campus. A jazz session with international student musicians will close the conference.

The Veil: An Insider's Look at the Hijab (Headscarf)

This community time workshop will feature an opening talk by returning Egyptian Fulbright Scholar Maha Mourad, a screening of the documentary film *The Four Hijabs*, and a panel discussion with North Central College students from the MENA (Middle East and North Africa) region. Homs' Rain

Tuesday, May 23, 6:30-9:00pm Smith Hall, Old Main

Set in Syria and based on real events in 2014, this feature film will be introduced by Prof. Riad Ismat, playwright, writer, and former Minister of Culture in Syria.

English Language Institute (ELI)

The English Language Institute (ELI) is excited to serve a total of 17 full-time and part-time students in the spring 2017 term. This is a 21% increase in student population when compared to the spring 2016 term. The 12 full-time and five part-time students hail from nine different countries: Argentina, Brazil, China, Colombia, Ecuador, Italy, Japan, Turkey, and Vietnam. Of the 17 students, five are taking North Central College credit-bearing classes to start their bridge into undergraduate or graduate coursework. Taking a credit-bearing along with intensive English language coursework enables students to work toward their long-term academic goals, develop meaningful connections with

North Central College students, and fully adapt to American education system.

Summer ELI Programming

Now that the spring term has started, ELI staff members are preparing for the three summer programs in July and August. The ELI will run an eight-week academic term in July and August, a twoweek Summer Language Academy for high school students in July, and a threeweek cultural immersion experience in August.

Soon, the ELI will be looking to hire NCC students with strong leadership skills, second language abilities, and experience living abroad to serve as counselors during the summer. The position is already posted on the NCC student employment site. Interested students should apply soon, as initial interviews will occur during the first weeks of spring term.
