What is the Dunham Education Scholars Program?


With generous support from the Dunham Fund, North Central College established the Dunham Education Scholars program for students from the greater Aurora area with a declared major in education and a commitment to return to the Aurora area as dedicated teachers. The program provides a \$25,000 scholarship, mentoring, networking and field experiences in Aurora schools—all designed to launch our Dunham Scholars into a successful teaching career in the Aurora area.

Who is eligible for the Dunham Education Scholarship?

Eligibility criteria for scholarship candidates includes:

- Residency within the Dunham Fund service area (bounded on the north by Illinois State Route 38, on the south by U.S. Route 34, on the east by Illinois State Route 59 and on the west by Illinois State Route 47)
- Intent to major in education and commitment to teach in the Aurora area after graduation
- Minimum cumulative high school GPA of 3.0
- Preferred SAT score of 1000 or higher

Benefits of being a Dunham Education Scholar:

- An annual scholarship award of \$5,000 for first-year and sophomore students and up to \$7,500 for juniors and seniors
- Additional scholarship funds for students interested in pursuing a bilingual endorsement
- Reimbursement of state-mandated test fees for education majors
- Individualized guidance from the program coodinator and peer support group
- Access to a North Central College alumni mentor who is a professional educator in Aurora
- Regular professional and personal development workshops with expert speakers on topics like loan forgiveness for teachers, organization and planning, résumé development, technology, networking, interviewing and time management
- Opportunities to attend professional conferences
- \$1,000 stipend for classroom materials as a first-year teacher at a school within the Dunham Fund service area
