Sophomore Year

NCC-in-Canterbury: earn elective and/or general education credit during this 12-week program in Canterbury, England. Live and learn alongside British and other international students. All North Central students take one course together that includes course-related field trips.

NCC-in-China/Japan: study Chinese and Japanese language and culture over 15 weeks during fall term. Eight weeks are spent studying in China and seven in Japan. A North Central faculty member and 10+ students go on this program. This program is offered every other year. Last offered: fall 2016.

NCC-in-Costa Rica: study Spanish language and Costa Rican culture for 15 weeks. The first half of the program students take intensive Spanish at the appropriate level (beginner-advanced). The second half of the program students complete an internship or service learning project based on their personal, professional and academic goals. A North Central faculty member and 10+ students go on this program.

Junior Year

Study abroad fall term of your junior year at your choice of 50+ of our programs abroad. Take courses to fulfill elective, general education and minor requirements.

To study abroad junior year, students must have completed the proof of basic skills (ACT, SAT, or TAP) required for elementary education by October of their sophomore year.
