Sophomore Year

NCC-in-Canterbury (England)

- Earn elective and/or general education credit during this 12-week program.
- All North Central students take one course together that includes course-related field trips.

NCC-in-China/Japan

- Study Chinese and Japanese language and culture during this 15-weeks during fall term.
- Eight weeks are spent studying in China and seven in Japan.
- A North Central faculty member and 10+ students go on this program.

NCC-in-Costa Rica

- Study Spanish language and Costa Rican culture for 15 weeks
- Take intensive Spanish at the appropriate level (beginner-advanced) for 8 weeks.
- Complete an internship or service learning project based on their personal, professional and academic goals.
- A North Central faculty member and 10+ students go on this program.

Junior Year

Students can study abroad fall of their junior year at their choice of 50+ of our programs abroad. Take courses to fulfill elective, general education and minor requirements.
