

## The Friendship Family Program North Central College 2017-2018

The Friendship Family Program at North Central College helps international students meet and maintain connections with local families. It is a great way to welcome students to the area!

Students are officially matched with families for a period of 3 months, 6 months or 9 months, depending on how long the student will attend NCC, but often the relationship continues beyond. We have families that continue to write us about past students, trying to remain in contact and to share with us good news from the students. Some friendship families are still in touch with their students from years ago and have visited them in their country.

The matching is done on the basis of requests by the volunteer families. The families may be traditional families, or they may be retired couples, singles, or single-parent families. They come from all walks of life, economic levels, and religions. They all have a common interest to learn about other cultures and share the American way of life.

The friendship families are not sponsors and should never be expected to provide financial assistance, nor should the families expect to be paid for their time. They do provide caring support and/or practical assistance in settling in and making one's way in the local community.

The number of contacts per term (3 months) and the kinds of activities done together vary greatly from one family to another. These matters are between the student and the friendship family. We ask that at a minimum you plan one event, dinner, or outing with the student per term.

Students do not need to feel obligated to accept every invitation. If students have class work to prepare, or if they do not wish to attend religious activities, for example, they are free to politely turn down an invitation. However, they should accept enough invitations (or initiate them) to develop a good relationship. If the families do not make contacts, students should notify the coordinator of The Friendship Family Program.

The Friendship Family Program does not have to involve students actually spending nights at the families' homes, but if both parties agree on a short stay, that could be discussed with the Center for Global Education. All students have on-campus housing during their stay in the U.S. and have no need for additional housing while school is in session. See below for between-session times when a homestay could occur if both parties were interested. Many times, however, students like to travel the U.S. during these breaks.
