INSTRUCTIONS Application for Admission

The following requirements must be met before an admission decision will be made on your application:

- 1. **APPLICATION.** Please complete the **attached** application form, answering all sections completely.
- 2. **ENGLISH PROFICIENCY.** Evidence of English proficiency must be submitted unless you are a citizen of Canada, UK, Ireland, Australia, or New Zealand. English proficiency for J-1 exchange students can ONLY be proven in one of the following ways: TOEFL 520 (paper) 69 (IBT), IELTS level 6, SAT 500 or ACT 22 or an original letter from a member of the English department at home school verifying the student has a proficiency level equivalent to TOEFL 520 and will succeed with a full-time course load at North Central College in the areas of reading, writing, listening, and speaking.
- 3. **AUTOBIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT.** Provide a one-page <u>handwritten</u> essay in English describing your plans for the degree or career you wish to pursue. Provide any additional information you feel the admission committee should have when reviewing your application.
- 4. **LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION.** Please submit two letters of academic reference from persons not related to you. The letters should focus on your character, personality, and seriousness of purpose. THIS LETTER MAY ONLY SERVE AS ENGLISH PROOF IF THE 520 SCORE IS REFERRENCED.
- 5. **EVIDENCE OF FINANCIAL SUPPORT.** Evidence of adequate financial resources to meet the costs of at least the number of semesters you will study at NCC must be submitted. The total estimated expenses for each semester of study at North Central College are outlined in your exchange agreement. Travel <u>is not</u> included in the estimate. You must submit the *Affidavit of Support* and a certified bank letter. Please see instructions included with the *Affidavit of Support*.
- 6. **HOUSING QUESTIONNAIRE.** Please complete the housing questionnaire form. Exchange students will all live with at least 1 U.S. student. Single rooms are not available for exchange students and students coming from the same country may not live together.
- 7. **ID PICTURE.** Please submit 2 small (2" x 2" passport size) pictures.
- 8. COPY OF PASSPORT PAGE. Please include a copy of the passport page that has the passport number on it.

Timely applicants will be notified of acceptance by email by April 20th. Applicants will then be asked to complete and submit the following forms:

- 1. HEALTH DOCUMENTS. Health documents must be completed and submitted before a student begins classes. All records must be signed and dated by a health care provider. The required immunization shots are: (a) diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis: students shall provide dates of any combination of three or more doses of diphteria, tetanus, and pertussis containing vaccine. One dose must be a Tdap vaccine. The last dose of vaccine (DPT, DTap, Dt or Tdap) must be within ten years prior to the semester of current enrollment; (b) Measles, Mumps, Rubella: students shall provide documentation of receipt of two doses of the MMR (Measles, Mumps, and Rubella) live vaccine. The first dose must be on or after their first birthday. The minimum time interval between each dose must be at least twenty-eight days; (c) Meningococcal vaccine: students under the age of 22 shall provide proof of at least one dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine on or after their 16th birthday; (d) one tuberculosis skin test within the last year (administered at NCC). If the TB skin test is positive, the student will need to obtain a blood test. BCG vaccine is not acceptable proof of TB status. INCOMPLETE HEALTH FORMS RESULT IN CANCELLED CLASS SCHEDULES!
- 2. All students must purchase GeoBlue health insurance coverage, regardless of current home country coverage. Our office tracks your enrollment online. Students may sign up and purchase this insurance before arriving at: https://ogse.geobluestudents.com/?ac=DQS-7213&CFID=57345426&CFTOKEN=%20539f3f0c4be44b25-3F29BF79-0FF9-CAC5-9DBAD9CED4D97C917213. The monthly rate for each student is around \$123.00 USD.
- **3. COURSE SELECTION FORM.** Students must register for at least 12-15 credit hours per semester. Most courses are 4 credits. Please refer to the course catalog and select five courses per semester. Students WILL NOT take 5 courses per semester, but choosing 5 gives the advisor more choices when arranging the schedule. If you are studying less than one year, please fill out only the semester that you will be studying at North Central College.

The Form DS-2019 for entry into the United States will be mailed to the student by **May 14th**, which they will use to apply at the American Consulate for a J-1 **exchange student** visa. Students should not enter the U.S. on another type of visa as it is not possible to change from one type to another.

J-1 visa applicants are required to pay a one-time SEVIS fee of \$220 to supplement the administration and maintenance costs of the Student and Exchange Information System (SEVIS). The fee must be paid at least 3 business days prior to applying for your visa, or applying for admission at a US port-of-entry for those exempt from the visa requirement. The fee can be paid online and must be accompanied by a Form I-901. It can be paid by you or by a third party, inside or outside the U.S. You will need the DS-2019 in front of you in order to pay.

To Pay Online

- 1. Find the Form I-901 at www.FMJfee.com.
- 2. Complete the form online and supply the necessary Visa, MasterCard or American Express information.
- *Be sure to write your name exactly as it appears on your Form DS-2019.
- 3. Print a copy of the online receipt and keep it with your other important immigration documents. Take all documents with you when applying for the visa.

Orientation information and arrival date information will be communicated in the acceptance letter. It is mandatory that you arrive in Chicago (O'Hare Airport ORD) on the arrival date designated. Housing assignments and roommate information will be communicated to the student as soon as they are assigned.
