English Language Institute (ELI)

- Full-time, year-round English as a second language (ESL) program
- Conditional undergraduate admission available
- Five eight-week terms offered each year
- No minimum TOEFL required
- Summer options available
- ELI to Degree Scholarships available for undergraduate study at North Central

Conditional Admission Application Process

Students who do not have the required level of English proficiency may apply for conditional undergraduate admission by submitting a completed undergraduate application and official transcripts. International Application Process

International Freshman Application Process

- Undergraduate Application (online)
- Official high school transcript (past three years)
- Minimum GPA of 3.0 preferred (4.0 scale)
- Official English proficiency documentation (below)

English Proficiency Documentation

The minimum English proficiency documentation required to be considered for direct admission to a degree program includes (choose one):

- Official TOEFL score of 79 IBT (Institution Code: 1555)
- Official IELTS score of 6.5
- Official SAT EBRW score of 490 (Institution Code: 1555)
- Official ACT English score of 19 (Institution Code: 1096)
- Grades of 'C' or higher in English writing courses taken at a U.S. college or university (transfer applicants)
- Successful completion of North Central's English Language Institute (ELI)

Visa

Admitted students who will need an F-1 student visa must submit a passport copy, financial document, and official high school transcripts to be issued an I-20 form.

Transfer students in the United States must complete and submit the transfer verification form.

Priority Deadlines

Offers of admission are made on an ongoing basis. Students applying from outside of the United States must submit a complete application by June 1 for the Fall Semester and by November 1 for the Spring Semester. Students already studying in the United States should apply two months prior to the intended start semester.
