ITINEPARY HIGHLIGHTS

- Apartheid Museum is acknowledged as the pre-eminent museum dealing with 20th century South Africa – at the heart of which is the apartheid story.
- Soweto Experience to learn about its history and engage in a two-way cultural community exchange.
- Game Drive South Africa's Big 5 (elephant, rhino, buffalo, lion, and leopard) to spot as you learn about them and other wildlife on a game drive through the reserve.
- Bo Kaap Walk with Storyteller where students learn the origins of the oldest suburb in South Africa.
- Cape Malay Cooking Experience a stepby-step process of making traditional Cape Malay dishes that are loved by locals in the community.
- The notorious Robben Island prison is a World Heritage Site where Africa's political prisoners, including former President Nelson Mandela, were kept during the colonial and Apartheid years of South Africa.

Course Description:

This course investigates the implications of racialized discourses, such as identifying as native or non-native English speakers. Particularly, this course challenges students to critically reflect on their multi-faceted identities as current or potential English language teachers and how might such identities impact their pedagogy, person, and positionality, within various contexts. The first half of the course begins with theoretical scholarship that targets language ideologies, race, and empires created by the two. The second half of the course focuses on narrative-driven epistemologies from professionals of color as a means of not only legitimizing racialized discourses within the field of English but also solidifying the need for further awareness and dialogues regarding race and language teaching.

Center for Global Education (CGE) Registration:

- November 1, 2023: Students enrolled in a CDCA will begin the registration process, be charged a non-refundable \$40 registration fee, and prompted to pay the non-refundable \$500 program fee deposit, through the Center for Global Education.
- January 19, 2024: Proof of a <u>valid</u> passport is due. (Current passports must be valid through November 2024 for May term travel, six (6) months past your return travel date.)
